Support for our Canadian Armed Forces members, Veterans, and their families

We work to improve the lives of military members and their families by providing financial assistance to promote family resiliency and support Veterans and serving members who may have an illness or injury through a variety of grants and programs. Examples of the support we have provided over the last year include:



167 Members

with a child with special needs received support

assisted through an Emergency Grant providing financial support during an immediate financial distress situation.



received support with scholarships and employment assistance through provincial license plate programs.



received from SISIP Financial to ensure members of the CAF community received support they needed through the Emergency Grant Program.



attended entrepreneurship and employment training.

enjoyed summer camp for the eighth annual National Summer Camps Program.

Get Involved

Support for our Canadian Armed Forces members, Veterans, and their families

Your involvement can make a real difference in the lives of those who serve our country with honour and pride, and who have given so much. There are many ways you can give back to military families, such as taking part in an event, raising money in your local area, or becoming one of our valued partners.



Over \$151K

was raised over the last year by the Funding Innovation Art Easel Program, with over \$1M realized since its inception. This program allows Canadians to contribute to Support Our Troops by bidding on Canadian-made, fully licensed sports, music, and traditional art prints at 350 easel-hosting establishments in 10 provinces.

Over \$242K

was raised through the License Plate Program. The program, adopted by Alberta, Manitoba, Ontario, and Saskatchewan, encourages Canadians to rally support for our military in an impactful way. Funds raised from the sale of these specialty plates support programs and initiatives in military communities located in the four participating provinces.

Over \$84K

was raised last year from participating Canadian Armed Forces Appreciation Games in partnership with the NHL, CHL, CFL, MLB, MLS NBA, and various minor league teams allowing Canadians to demonstrate support to the brave individuals who serve our country.



Campaigns

Our donors are at the heart of Support Our Troops. With your help, we can have a positive impact on the lives of thousands of military members and their families.

CANEX

CANEX, Canada's Military store and preferred retail provider of the Canadian Armed Forces, launched the Gift of Giving campaign. In June and December, CANEX customers made personal donations either in-store or online to Support Our Troops. With CANEX's generosity in matching each donation dollar for dollar, in June 2021, CANEX raised \$18,869.57 championing the provision of Special Needs Facilitators in Personnel Support Program Camps and the Soldier On Equipment Grant Program. In December 2021, CANEX raised \$26,734.68 championing the Support Our Troops Holiday Hamper Program and the Soldier On Equipment Grant Program.

ONroute

During the months of November and December, all 23 ONroute locations along Highways 400 and 401 in Ontario championed Support Our Troops and the Holiday Hamper Program. ONroute asked customers to donate \$1 with every transaction. Thousands of ONroute customers said "Thank You" to our military members with donations totaling over \$144,000.

Canada Army Run

Canada Army Run is about Canadians and the Canadian Armed Forces – Air Force, Army, and Navy – joining together in the spirit of camaraderie and community. The Canada Army Run offers an opportunity for participants to fundraise for Support Our Troops and Soldier On. Last year, Canada Army Run's 2021 virtual event raised \$400,000. 17584

Navy Bike Ride

The Navy Bike Ride is a family-friendly event for cyclists of all ages. Funds raised by the participants of the Navy Bike Ride support three organizations dedicated to the well-being of our military community: Support Our Troops, Soldier On, and the Royal Canadian Navy Benevolent Fund. Last year, \$102,000 was raised.
